Canadians Want Federal Government to Retain Drug Harm Reduction Programs

Most Canadians would legalize marijuana, not other hard drugs.

[VANCOUVER – May 12, 2007] – Canadians continue to offer mixed reviews on the federal government’s plans to deal with illegal drug use, a new Angus Reid Strategies poll has found.

In the online survey of a representative national sample, 71 per cent of respondents endorse the decision to call for mandatory minimum prison sentences and large fines for marijuana grow operators and drug dealers.

A larger proportion of Canadians—86 per cent—support the creation of a National Anti-Drug Strategy, which includes drug-awareness campaigns.

However, 57 per cent of respondents believe the administration headed by Stephen Harper would be wrong to eliminate “harm reduction” programs, such as supervised injection sites and needle-exchange programs.

In British Columbia—where Vancouver’s Insite facility has been operating since 2003—opposition to ending supervised injection sites climbs to 64 per cent.

The poll also shows that a majority of Canadians continue to hold tolerant views on marijuana consumption. A majority of respondents (56%) oppose the current government’s decision to scrap the marijuana decriminalization legislation that was discussed during Paul Martin’s tenure as prime minister.

KEY FINDINGS

- » **57% oppose ending harm reduction programs, such as supervised injection sites**
- » **44% think Canada has a serious drug abuse problem**
- » **53% support marijuana legalization**
- » **71% support government proposal to ensure minimum prison sentences and fines for marijuana grow operators and drug dealers**

*From May 8 to May 9, 2007, Angus Reid Strategies conducted an online survey among a randomly selected, representative sample of **1,004 adult Canadians**. The margin of error for the total sample is **+/- 3.1%, 19 times out of 20**. The results have been statistically weighted according to the most current education, age, gender and region Census data to ensure a sample representative of the entire adult population of Canada. Discrepancies in or between totals are due to rounding.*

In addition, 53 per cent of Canadians actually support the legalization of cannabis. Less than 10 per cent of respondents believe five other illegal substances—crack cocaine, powder cocaine, ecstasy, heroin, and methamphetamine or "crystal meth—should be legalized.

More than two-in-five respondents (44%) believe Canada has a serious drug abuse problem that affects the whole country, while 35 per cent believe Canada's drug abuse problem is confined to specific areas and people. Only 15 per cent of respondents—including 20 per cent in Ontario—think Canada does not have a serious drug abuse problem.
