**Trudeau the best prime minister;
Mulroney the worst, say Canadians**

**Trudeau leadership still resonates nationwide—
ranks best on international relations,
national unity, and more**

**Chrétien rates best on environment, worst on U.S.
relations, international affairs, and health care**

**Mulroney, Martin rate well in Quebec;
Harper beloved in Alberta, reviled by Atlantic Canada**

From June 15 to 18, 2007, Angus Reid Strategies conducted an online survey among a randomly selected, representative sample of 1,028 adult Canadians. The margin of error for the total sample is +3.1%, 19 times out of 20. The results have been statistically weighted according to the most current education, age, gender and region Census data to ensure a sample representative of the entire adult population of Canada. Discrepancies in or between totals are due to rounding.

[VANCOUVER - June 28, 2007] – Nearly 40 years after he first came to power, Pierre Trudeau’s tenure as prime minister continues to stand out for Canadians, a new Angus Reid Strategies poll has found.

In the online survey of a representative national sample, 42 per cent of Canadians rate Trudeau as Canada’s best prime minister since 1968. Trudeau is the top choice across every region in the country and almost all demographics.

Trudeau also emerges as the leader with the best record on four of eight national issues, more than any other prime minister. Canadians believe Trudeau did better than any other leader on international relations (31%), health care (21%), federal/provincial relations (18%), and national unity (31%).

However, Canadians also rank Trudeau as the worst prime minister on federal/provincial relations (19%) and national unity (19%), likely owing to controversial political moves such as the National Energy Program and the Constitution Act, 1982. Trudeau also rates as the worst prime minister on the economy (tied with Mulroney at 17%) and aboriginal affairs (12%).

The poll also finds that Brian Mulroney is considered Canada’s worst prime minister, with 21 per cent selecting him as the worst leader since 1968. Mulroney, who was prime minister from 1984 to 1993, was widely unpopular during his leadership because of patronage scandals and the introduction of the GST, among other things.

But Mulroney ranks highly in Quebec. Quebeckers rate him second to Trudeau as best prime minister since 1968 (28% to Trudeau’s 32%), and Bloc Quebecois voters especially believe Mulroney is the best overall leader (40% to Trudeau’s 27%). Paul Martin also does well in Quebec, with many seeing him as having the best record on six of the eight national issues included in the survey (all but aboriginal affairs and international relations).

Instead, Quebeckers see Jean Chrétien as the worst prime minister of Canada over the past 40 years, picked by 28 per cent of Quebec respondents and 40 per cent of BQ voters. Alberta also agrees, with 30 per cent of Albertans picking Chrétien as the worst leader.

Chrétien, however, does rate as the leader with the best record on two national issues—the environment (11% - tied with Stephen Harper and Paul Martin) and aboriginal affairs (15%). But he ranks as the worst on U.S. relations (20%), international relations (15%), and health care (13%).

Mulroney is considered to have the best record on U.S. relations (29%), likely due to his close relationship with then-president Ronald Reagan and the negotiation of free trade agreements during his term. And Paul Martin is selected by 19 per cent of Canadians as the leader with the best record on the economy.

In Alberta, Stephen Harper enjoys a high degree of popularity, ranking second to Trudeau as best prime minister since 1968 (22% to Trudeau's 26%). Albertans also consider Harper to have the best record on six of the eight national issues in the poll (all but U.S. and international relations). Again, Chrétien is seen as the worst prime minister overall by Albertans.

But in Atlantic Canada, 28 per cent pick Harper as the worst leader since 1968, with Mulroney coming a close second (27%). Possibly owing to the recent furor over the Atlantic Accord, Atlantic Canadians rate Harper as having the worst record on seven of the eight national issues discussed in the survey (all but U.S. relations).

As well, across Canada, Harper ranks worst on the environment (21%) and health care (13% — tied with Chrétien).

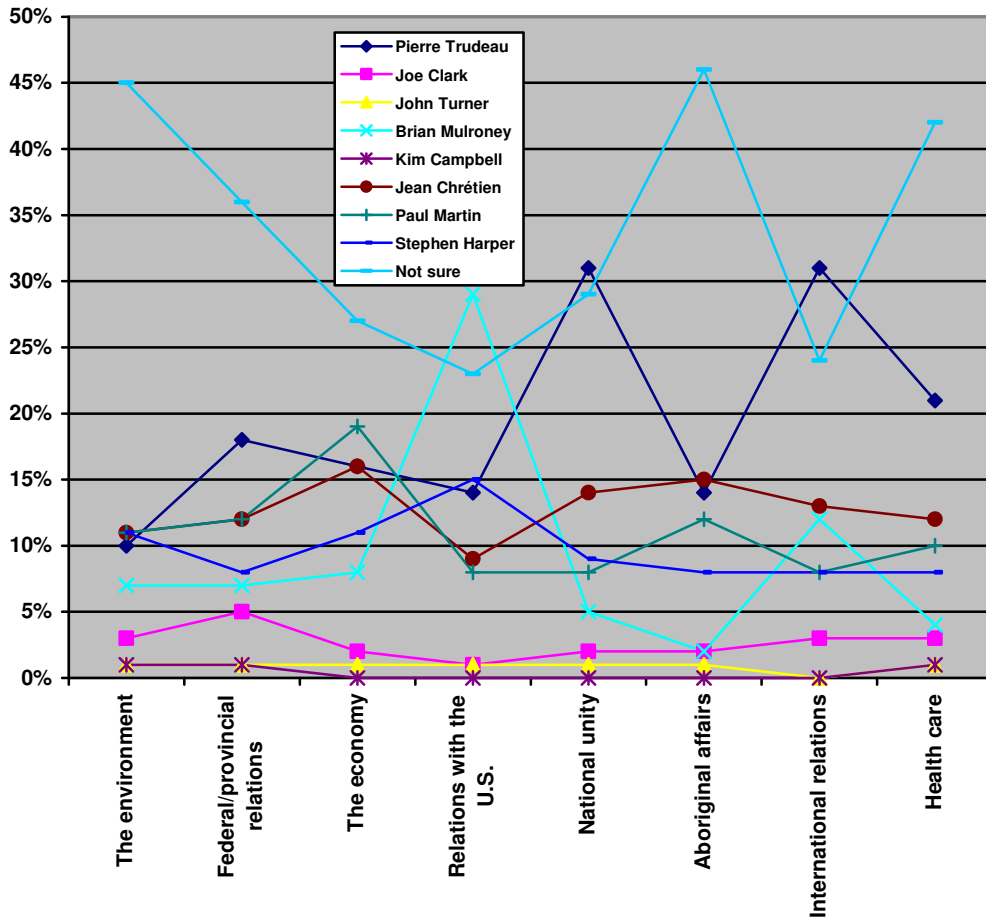

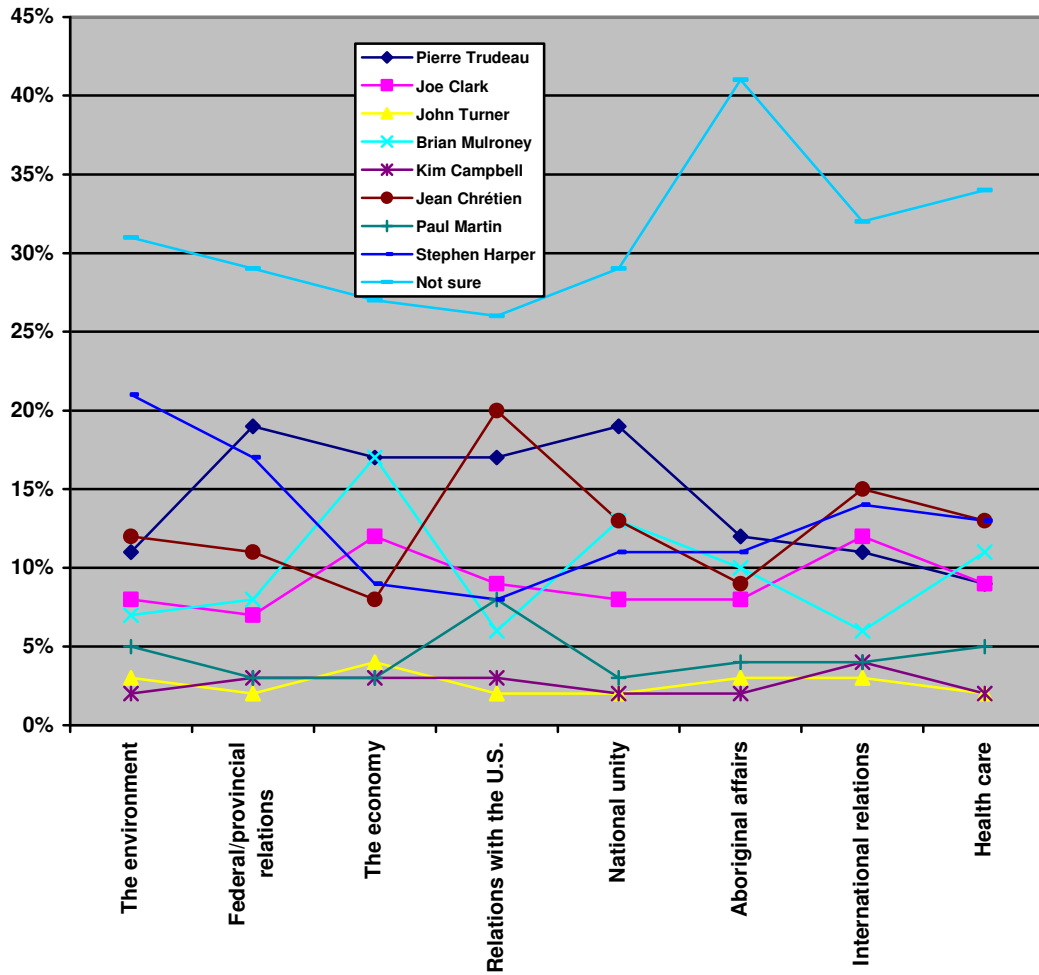
